

Chingford Town Centre

Waltham Forest Council was awarded £27million by Transport for London to improve the borough's roads and town centres making them great places to live, work and travel around.

Chingford Town Centre is one of four town centres schemes which aim to create attractive streets and green spaces to encourage local people to spend more time enjoying these areas while shopping and travelling. The area will undergo a number of changes to improve conditions for people who walk and cycle, as well as making improvements to the look and feel of the public spaces bringing a wide range of benefits to residents and businesses.

Between 6 April and 27 April 2016, we conducted a perception survey to find out what local people think about the area and the type of improvements they would like to see. The survey was online as well as over 22,500 copies hand delivered to all households in the area. 1,527 people responded and provided over 1,000 individual comments.

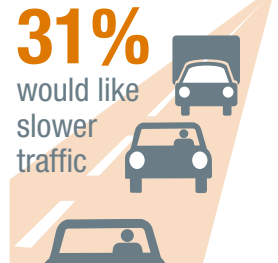
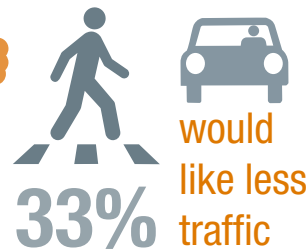
The results from the perception survey have been used to inform the design for Chingford Town Centre.

The headline results are below and based on multiple choice questions:

39% of respondents would like to see more plants and trees to make **Chingford Town Centre** more pleasant for walking and cycling



45% of respondents would like to see better pavements
